## Investment Philosophy

We believe fixed income markets are inefficient in pricing short-term liquidity and default risk and provide managers with an opportunity to add value relative to benchmark indices

## Investment Approach

- Utilizing a top-down process, we seek to generate excess returns by actively managing sector and yield curve positioning along with bottom up security selection while controlling duration risk
- Broadly diversify across the U.S. investment-grade universe
- At a minimum, the average portfolio quality is Aa3 or AA-<sup>5</sup> while the maximum duration of any investment is twelve years.

- Risk is evaluated and managed at the portfolio, sector and security levels

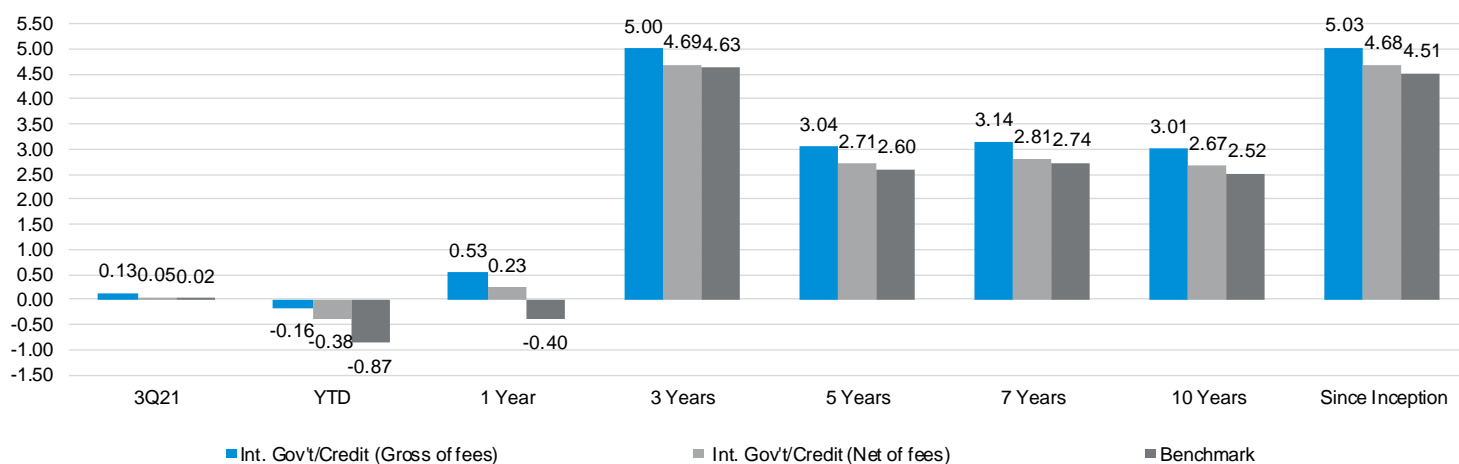

## Quarterly Performance Attribution<sup>2</sup>

The strategy outperformed given our overweight to spread product despite the Treasury rate moves.

- (+) Treasury inflation protected securities (TIPs) added to performance.
- (-) RMBS – Both agency and non-agency CMOs detracted from performance
- (+) CMBS – Both agency (multifamily) and non-agency large loan SASBs securities added to performance.
- (+) Taxable municipals – Were additive to performance and benefitted from more targeted fiscal stimulus specifically in essential services and airport/transportation bonds.
- (+) IG Corporates – Utilities, Insurance and Healthcare added to performance.

## Strategy

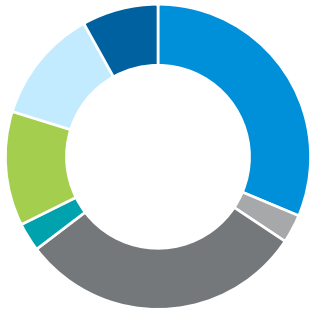
We are somewhat cautious about the near-term prospects of the US economy given recent mixed economic data, the potential for higher corporate tax rates, growing signs of margin pressures and continuing supply constraints. In our view, valuations are rich across the fixed income universe, and we believe inflation, shifting of consumer expectations and/or the easing of monetary policy has the potential to create volatility going forward. We believe, the Fed's removal of its crisis-era loose monetary policy, no matter how well telegraphed, could also lead to higher spread volatility. Looking ahead we anticipate sticking to our more defensive, up-in-quality positioning that we adjusted over the quarter by reducing our spread duration and holding more nominal treasuries until we see a better entry point develop to increase our risk profile. We will also continue to barbell the portfolio with floating rate securities in the front end and fixed bullets out the yield curve during periods of curve steepening in order to take advantage of carry and rolldown opportunities. As such, we believe sector and security selection will remain the main drivers in generating any excess returns as we aim to maintain/build our yield advantage relative to our benchmark indices to help drive performance.

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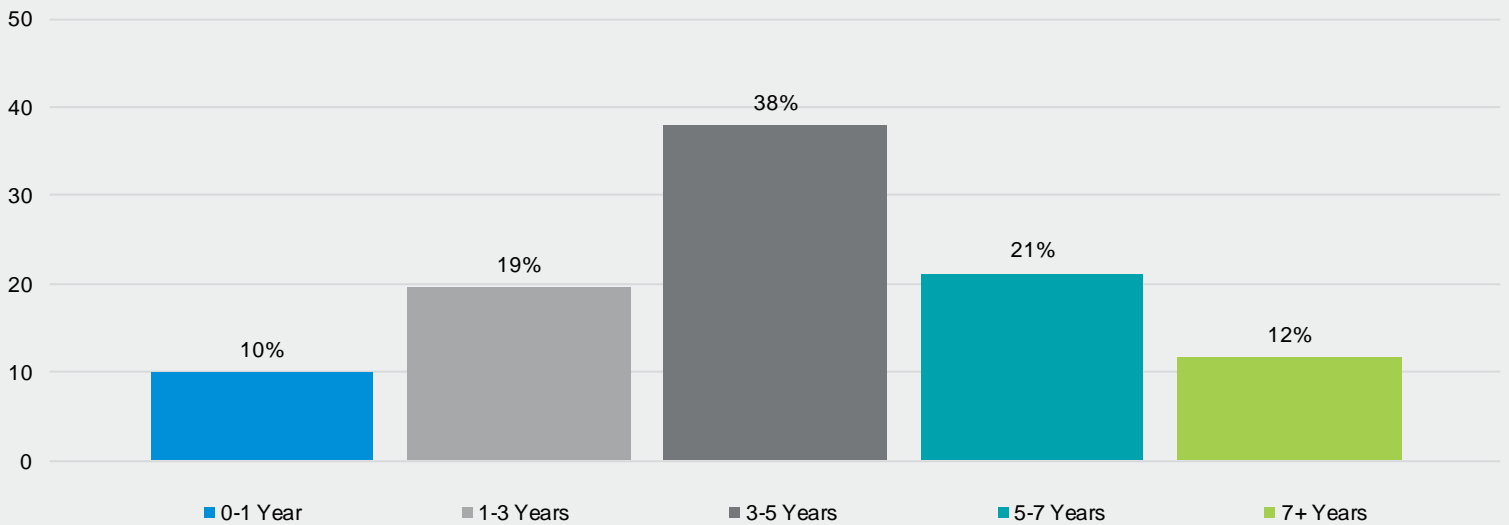

- Prior to July 1, 2019, the investment team was part of a prior firm. Therefore, "% Total Firm Assets" is left blank for year ends before the team joined MetLife Investment Management.

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The creation date of the Intermediate Government/Credit Fixed Income ("Intermediate Government/Credit") composite is November 1, 2008 and the inception date is January 1, 1997. Prior to July 1, 2019, the performance of the composite represents the performance that occurred while members of the management team were affiliated with prior firms. The composite has been examined for the periods November 1, 2008 to June 30, 2019 while at another firm. The prior firm, LCP, was verified for the periods November 1, 2007 to June 30, 2019. The verification and performance examination reports are available upon request.

The Intermediate Government/Credit strategy seeks to generate total returns in excess of the Barclays Intermediate U.S. Government/Credit Index over a market cycle through the active management of sector, yield curve, security and duration allocations. The Intermediate Government/Credit composite includes all fee-paying portfolios equal to or over \$10 million, managed on a discretionary basis according to the applicable composite strategy. The Firm maintains a complete list and description of composites which are available upon request. Policies for valuing portfolios, calculating performance and preparing compliant presentations are available upon request.

The performance benchmark for the Intermediate Government/Credit composite is the Barclays Intermediate U.S. Government/Credit Index, which measures the performance of Treasuries, government-related and investment grade U.S. corporate securities with a remaining maturity between one and 10 years. The benchmark does not reflect holdings in all sectors targeted within the Intermediate Government/Credit strategy, which also includes agency, securitized, municipal and money market sectors. It is not possible to invest directly in an unmanaged index. All index returns presented are provided to represent the investment environment existing during the time periods shown and will not be covered by the future report of independent verifiers. For comparison purposes, the indices are fully invested and include the reinvestment of income. The returns for the indices do not include any transaction costs, management fees or other costs.

Returns are based on fully discretionary accounts under management and may include terminated accounts. The dispersion of annual returns is measured by the standard deviation among asset-weighted portfolio returns represented within the composite for the full year. Dispersion is not calculated for composites with five or fewer accounts for the whole period.

Performance returns are presented gross and net of fees, include the reinvestment of all income and are calculated in U.S. dollars. Dividend income has been recorded net of all applicable foreign withholding taxes. The investment management fee schedule for the Intermediate Government/Credit composite is 0.30% on the first \$25 million, 0.25% on amounts from \$25 million to \$100 million and 0.20% on amounts from \$100 million to \$200 million and 0.15% amounts over \$200. Net returns have been calculated by reducing the monthly gross returns by a model fee equal to the highest stated ADV fee for the strategy. Net returns have been calculated by reducing the monthly gross returns by the highest stated ADV fee of 0.35%. For periods prior to January 2013, net returns have been calculated using actual management fees. Beginning January 1, 2013, net returns were calculated by reducing the monthly gross returns by the highest stated ADV fee. From January 1, 2013 to March 31, 2018, the highest ADV fee was 0.35%. Beginning April 1, 2018, the highest stated ADV fee has been 0.30%. Investment management fees are described in greater detail in the Firm's ADV. Individual client returns will be reduced by investment management fees and other expenses that the account may incur. Fees have a compounding effect on cumulative results. Actual investment management fees incurred by clients may vary.

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
